Ongoing Funding Sources

Richmond Parish Lands Charity

Purpose:

- The relief of poverty in the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames.
- The relief of sickness and distress in the Borough.
- The provision and support of leisure and recreational facilities
- The provision of educational facilities and support for people in Richmond wishing to undertake courses.
- Any other charitable purpose for the benefit of the inhabitants of Richmond.

Grants are available to both organisations and individuals and cover two strands of Main Grants Programme (Sharon le Ronde) and Education Grants (Amy Vogel).

RPLC also manage two linked charities.

The Bailey and Bates Trust

Purpose:

- The relief of poverty within SW14 postcode.

Its charitable objects are advancing education (including social and physical training) of persons who are under the age of 25 years who are in need of financial assistance. Grants are available to individuals and organisations.

Barnes Relief in Need

Purpose:

- The relief of poverty in the former borough of Barnes prior to 1965 (which roughly corresponds with SW14 postcode).

Available for children and young people, the elderly and people with disabilities and to individuals and organisations.
