#### **Richmond Parish Lands Charity**

Richmond Parish Lands Charity (RPLC) operates within a closely defined benefit area comprised of TW9, TW10, SW13, and SW14.

RPLC's four grant priorities guide the awarding of grants. They are:

- Accessing support and advice
- · Reducing inequalities in education
- Improving health outcomes
- Enhancing community cohesion

The fifth grant priority, to strengthen the local voluntary and community sector, sits across all of their work.

Grants are available to both organisations and individuals and cover the two strands of the Main Grants Programme (Sarah Wilkins) and Education Grants (Amy Vogel).

## **Hampton Fund**

The Hampton Fund's area of benefit covers the following areas within Richmond upon Thames: Hampton, Hampton Hill, Hampton Wick, Teddington, Twickenham, and Whitton.

The Hampton Fund supports families and individuals on low incomes with grants to help with the costs of gas and electricity and essential household items. It also provides grants to the voluntary sector to provide services and activities for people in need.

The Barnes Fund provides grants for organisations and individuals. The boundaries of the "Ancient Parish of Barnes" broadly correspond with the present postal area of London SW13.

The Barnes Fund's purpose is as follows:

- To provide funding for organisations that help relieve people who are in hardship or distress, with disabilities or unwell – both physically and mentally – and older people
- To fund organisations that offer education or recreational and leisure facilities for the wellbeing of the whole Barnes community
- To help individuals or families who are on a low income or in distress and to provide educational grants to individuals

# The Victoria Foundation - medical support transforming lives

The Victoria Foundation is a medical charity based in Richmond. It concentrates on providing medical equipment and assistance in four key areas:

- Mobility aids
- Accessible transport
- Medical assistance supporting organisations and individuals with grants for medical equipment and support not funded by the state

 Medical toolkit grants and elective bursaries - support widening participation in medicine by awarding UK students studying at UK universities toolkit grants for the purchase of books, medical instruments, and travel costs for placements and elective bursaries

For organisations and individuals, their focus is on those living or working in the boroughs of Richmond and Kingston, but applications from across London and Surrey can be considered. The foundation offers a rolling programme of grants, typically between £250 and £5,000, with four panel meetings across the year.

# The Richmond upon Thames Voluntary Fund

The Richmond upon Thames Voluntary Fund is an independent charitable trust established to provide the local community the opportunity to donate to local organisations that make a difference to the lives of vulnerable people in the borough. Annually, the trustees identify a group of beneficiaries and a theme based on need, and then invite expressions of interest from organisations (usually in the autumn) seeking to be beneficiary charities in the following year. In previous years, there has been a focus on children and young people's health and wellbeing.

Eligible activity includes a wide range of sports and physical exercise and arts and cultural activity that supports health and wellbeing. The fund also has a healthy eating and nutrition priority. Microgrants of up to £1,000 are available, as well as main grants of up to £5,000.

The Ham & Petersham Association and Amenities Group is dedicated to maintaining the special semi-rural heritage of Ham and Petersham. They have a small grants programme to support this. Applications must show how they will achieve this in one or more of the following areas:

- Developing volunteer activities
- · Fostering community spirit
- Maintaining or improving the local environment
- Improving public amenities
- Enhancing features of beauty or historic or of public interest and amenity value

# They will not fund:

- · Work that should be carried out by LBRUT
- Activities or projects not for the benefit of people living in Ham & Petersham

The highest award will be £3,000, though more typically they award £250 to £500.

Additionally, **The Cockayne - Grants for the Arts** includes Richmond in its benefit area. This supports art projects in London that provide opportunities for artists from diverse backgrounds.
