

Local Markets & Summer Fairs 2026

Seasonal fairs and local markets offer a range of opportunities to local voluntary groups and charities to raise your profile in the community, raise funds on a stall and/or raise funds by being chosen as a beneficiary charity. Please always check individual websites for up-to-date information

Local Markets

Ham Parade Market

Ham Parade Market is open on the first Saturday of the month (excluding January) and offers crafts and fresh produce. Its mission is “investment in the community, for the community, by the community”. The market supports a different local charity each month, providing a free of charge stall for a charity to raise awareness and/or funds. Apply [here](#). In addition, they run a raffle at each market with the proceeds donated to that month’s charity. To date they have raised over £18,000 for local good causes. Kew Village Market

Kew Village Market is usually held on the first Sunday of the month except in January. It is run by volunteers with the aim of helping local good causes and to encourage footfall to the Kew Village area. Since 2011 they have donated £100,000 to local charities. Awards are made four times a year in October, December, March and July and range from £500 to £1,000, although they are happy to consider smaller and larger requests. Surbiton Farmers Market

For local charities and good causes that also have beneficiaries in Kingston, Surbiton Farmers Market (SFM) is run by the community for the community. It takes place on the third Saturday of the month and since 2009 has raised over £65,000 for local charities. Each month a charity can have a free stall to promote what they do and raise funds. To give them a helping hand, the market adds a donation which currently stands at £500. Towards the end of the year, charities are invited to request more significant funding to support larger projects in the community. [Visit the Surbiton Farmers Market website.](#)

Local Fairs

Richmond May Fair (Richmond Green) – 9th May 2026

Richmond May Fair takes place on Richmond Green and the area around the parish church of St Mary Magdalene and Richmond Green. Using the profits from the Fair Richmond May Fair Charities Fund awarded 19 small grants to local charities. [Visit the Richmond May Fair website here.](#)

The Rotary Fair on Twickenham Green - 26th May 2026

Ham Fair (Ham Common) – 13th June 2026

This annual fair, organised by Ham and Petersham Association and Amenities Group donates its profits to good causes. A charity stallholder rate is available. Fair, stallholder information and booking is available at the [Ham Fair website here.](#)

Kew Midsummer Fete (Kew Green) – 20th June 2026

This very popular fair donates all its operating profits to local charities and, since it began in 2010, has donated more than £245,000 to good causes in the Richmond area. Teddington Village Fair (Udney Hall Gardens) – TBC

The Teddington Village Fair was organised by the Rotary Club of Teddington & The Hamptons in 2025. There is no information available currently, but the usual date is the end of June.

St Margarets Fair (Moormead Park) – TBC (normally 1st weekend of July)

Half the proceeds of this fair go to five schools – Orleans Primary, St Mary's, St Stephens, Orleans Park and The Deer Park School - with the remaining 50% supporting selected local charities. Further information available the St Margarets Fair website here.

Barnes Fair (Barnes Green) – 11th July 2026

The annual Barnes Fair featuring more than 300 charity stalls, takes place on Barnes Green and raises money for Barnes Community Association (BCA), who distribute it to support local charities by request. If you are a Barnes-based charity, you can apply for a grant from the BCA throughout the year.
